

## Articulation Agreement Southern New Hampshire University and Thomas Nelson Community College

Southern New Hampshire University (SNHU) and Thomas Nelson Community College (TNCC), in the spirit of academic cooperation, and in order to facilitate the transfer of graduates of TNCC to SNHU, hereby do enter into an academic articulation agreement.

This Articulation Agreement, made this 2 day of Thomas Nelson Community College is as follows:

1. SNHU welcomes students who wish to transfer from TNCC. Based on the attached course equivalency tables, SNHU guarantees transfer of the following associate's degrees in their entirety to the following SNHU bachelor's degree programs:

AA in Liberal Arts AS in Business Administration

AS in Social Science AS in Information Technology

AAS in Accounting AAS in Administration of Justice AAS in Management (Marketing)

AAS in Fire Science Technology and Human Services

- 2. SNHU and TNCC will treat this articulation agreement as a two-plus-two arrangement, encouraging students to complete the associate's degree program before enrolling in a bachelor's degree program. TNCC agrees to regularly communicate to students enrolled in related associate's degree programs via email and direct mail (costs to be incurred by SNHU) and to host SNHU representatives on campus for recruitment activities during the academic school year.
- 3. As SNHU and TNCC are regionally accredited, all academic course work in which a student has earned a grade of "C" or higher is fully transferable based on the attached course equivalents. Academic course work in which a student has earned a more credits are granted junior status, and no more than 90 credits will be accepted in transfer to a bachelor degree program.
- 4. Military students enrolling at SNHU can transfer up to 45 hours for an associate's degree and up to 90 hours for a bachelor's with SNHU for an A.A. or A.S.; last 10 classes for a B.A. or B.S.).
- 5. Students transferring from TNCC may enroll at SNHU in the full-time day program in Manchester, online, or through any of our Continuing Education centers which offer courses evenings, weekends, and on-line year round in Manchester, Salem, Nashua, and Portsmouth, NH and in Brunswick, ME. Not all majors are offered at each center.



- 6. The application fee to SNHU is waived. Students who enroll as full-time students in the SNHU Undergraduate Day Program with a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 2.5 and higher will be eligible for academic scholarships and grants.
- 7. This Articulation Agreement is based on the current curriculum of both educational institutions. The attached course equivalents shall serve as the basis for transferring coursework. Each institution is responsible for notifying the other of any substantive changes to the curriculum. This agreement shall be reviewed by both institutions every four years.
- 8. This Articulation Agreement may be terminated by either party by giving notice in writing to the other party at least twenty-four months prior to the date of termination. The official, signed document, stamped "ORIGINAL" is to be filed in the VPAA office, and signed copies will be distributed to appropriate parties.
