EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES INSTRUCTOR

Thomas Nelson Community College seeks dynamic, qualified individuals to join the faculty at the fourth largest community college in the Virginia Community College System. As a comprehensive community college, Thomas Nelson offers quality transfer degree programs, strong technical and pre-professional programs, and is known for its outreach to the community as a partner and leader in workforce development. The college also provides dual enrollment courses in partnership with local school divisions and developmental studies for students who need preparatory work to be successful in college-level coursework. Daytime, evening and weekend courses are taught at the Hampton, Southeast Center and Historic Triangle campus location as well as off-campus sites.

The college seeks candidates committed to the mission of the comprehensive community college and experienced in working with a diverse student population, including adult learners and at-risk students. The successful candidates will be committed to academic excellence and continuous improvement through professional development, assessment, program and course development, and creating a collegial environment of civility, collaboration and open communication. The college strives for a faculty of content experts who are also knowledgeable about best practices, innovative strategies, and instructional technologies that support teaching and learning. Outreach and service to the college community (developing partnerships, academic advising, and committee work and faculty governance) along with the ability to teach 15 credits per semester, are also expectations.

Responsibilities include: Teach up to 15 credit hours/24 contact hours of lecture, laboratory and/or clinical courses each semester. Teaching load may include day, evening, weekend and online course assignments at both campuses and off-site locations. Utilize high levels of energy, creativity, and motivation to design and implement effective teaching and learning practices. Facilitate student learning through in-class and out-of-class activities. Engage students during office hours, tutoring, remediation and mentoring activities. Devote appropriate time weekly to lecture/lab/clinical preparation and documentation of student clinical performance. Utilize BlackBoard to augment classes. Evaluate student learning. Plan, implement, assess and revise curriculum. Serve as an academic advisor for health professions students. Actively contribute to the institution through participation in program and division meetings, and service on college governance and other committees. Collaborate with faculty, staff and students in a diverse and collegial organizational culture with high standards for performance. Remain current in EMS practice, EMS education, and trends in community college education through professional development, further education, and/or scholarship. Adhere to the policies of Thomas

Nelson Community College and the Virginia Community College System as well as the Virginia Office of EMS and the Committee on Accreditation of Education Programs for the Emergency Medical Services Professions (CoAEMSP) standards.

Minimum Qualifications: Associate's degree from a regionally accredited institution in emergency medical services (EMS) or a related field. Minimum of two (2) years full time clinical/field in emergency medical services. Excellent written communication skills. Commitment to the community college philosophy and to teaching traditional and non-traditional students from a variety of backgrounds. Current, unexpired National Registry or Commonwealth of Virginia certification as an EMT-Paramedic. Current CPR certification (BLS for Healthcare Providers). Must be able to work at all campus locations. Criminal history and other background checks will be required of the finalist candidate for the position. Satisfactory reference and background checks are a condition of employment. Finalist candidate(s) will be required to provide documentation of routine healthcare employee immunizations. Drug screening may also be required.

Preferred Qualifications: Bachelor's degree in a related field from a regionally accredited institution. Recent teaching experience in a CoAEMSP-accredited community college EMS education program. Current, unexpired instructor certification in BLS, ACLS, PALS/PEEP and/or ITLS/PHTLS. Experience teaching paramedic-level lecture courses. Experience working with a faculty team to develop and align curricula and assessment plans. Experience serving as a preceptor, documenting clinical skill competence, and evaluating affective skills for EMS pre-professionals. Diverse professional experiences within EMS. Experience coordinating student clinical rotations. Experience using skills competency software such as Platinum Planner. Recent professional and community activities in the EMS profession. Knowledge of and experience with EMS education accreditation standards and processes. Effective interpersonal communication skills. Experience using instructional technologies, administering computer based tests, facilitating high-fidelity simulation activities, and utilizing learning management systems such as Blackboard. Familiarity with local EMS council, volunteer and paid EMS agencies. Experience preparing students for success on state and national EMS practical and cognitive examinations. Demonstrated organizational and leadership skills. Ability to develop and maintain effective collaborations with local healthcare providers, community/field agencies, and four-year colleges and universities.
