This program requires prospective students to successfully complete a criminal background check, drug screen, and to be medically cleared by a physician completing a medical physical.	This career studies certificate is designed to prepare students who successfully complete all program requirements to attempt the national certification examination as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). EMTs work and/or volunteer in hospitals, transport agencies, fire-rescue-emergency medical services organizations, and in the military. Use your Career Studies Certificate in Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) to help you gain admission into a career as an Emergency Medical Technician. EMTs work in fire departments, emergency and non-emergency medical response and transportation, special events medical care, hospitals, and serve in critical life-saving positions in the military, and as part of special response teams in law enforcement and federal government agencies. This program requires prospective students to successfully complete a criminal background check, drug screen, and to be medically cleared by a physician completing a	This course prepares students to qualify for Virginia's Certified Nursing Assistant Examination (written and manual skills). Nurse Aides (Care Partners) work in medical facilities providing direct patient care under the supervision of a licensed nurse. This short duration program provides instruction that prepares students to attempt the Nurse Aide certification examination. Successfully licensed/certified nurse aides are eligible for indemand, gainful employment opportunities in hospitals, short and long-term care healthcare facilities, senior living facilities, and home healthcare settings. This program requires prospective students to successfully complete a criminal background check, drug screen, and to be medically cleared by a physician completing a medical physical.	This course prepares students to qualify for the National Healthcareer Association (NHA) Certified Clinical Medical Assistant Certification Exam (CCMA). Clinical Medical Assistants work in medical facilities providing direct patient care and indirect patient services under the supervision of a licensed medical professional. This short-duration program provides instruction that prepares students to attempt the Clinical Medical Assistant certification examination. Successfully certified clinical medical assistants are eligible for in-demand, gainful employment opportunities in hospitals, short and long-term care healthcare facilities, senior living facilities, home healthcare settings, and physician's offices. Successfully certified students seeking employment may be subject to the requirements of prospective employers, which often include the successful completion of a criminal background check, drug screen, and to be medically cleared by a physician completing a
