Nursing Program Pre-Admission Testing Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS)

General Information:

The TNCC Nursing Department requires an **online nursing assessment test (ATI TEAS)** as a part of the admission process. Any student who applies to the nursing program **MUST** complete the ATI TEAS in order to be considered for admission. The ATI TEAS score will be used in conjunction with other criteria to determine admission into nursing programs.

Due to COVID-19 this exam will be remotely proctored so you can take the test from your home, instead of coming to campus. Please check the nursing webpage for more direction for remote testing as it becomes available at <https://tncc.edu/health/nursing/information-and-resources>.

You will receive your test date in an email from Enrollment Services in Hampton or Tamera Wright at the Historic Triangle Campus after receipt of your completed on-line application packet is confirmed. The test will begin at 10 AM.

The ATI TEAS exam is designed to predict the academic readiness of applicants prior to admission into a program of study in nursing. The four subjects in the exam are Math, Science, English, and Reading. Students may only take the test once during each admission period. Students may use the calculator embedded in the test or their own 4-function calculator. Scrap paper and pencils can also be used.

Please set up your ATI TEAS account prior to your scheduled test date to create your username and password.

Cost:

The ATI TEAS testing fee is **\$70.00** and must be paid online with a credit card or a debit card at the time of testing.

Time:

Students should allow up to four (4) hours for the total test time and should be logged in and ready to begin by **10:00 AM** or a little early if possible. Even though you can test from home, it is still a timed test. If you log in late, you will be required to reschedule, and this is subject to availability.
