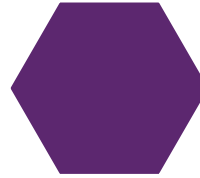

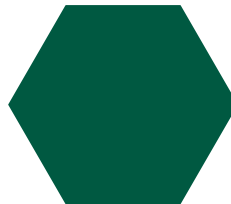

PN to Professional Nursing CSC (LPN-RN bridge program) consists of 2 classes (NSG115 and NSG200) which are day only in the summer session. After completion of this bridge certificate, students will declare preference for day or evening/weekend RN program and join 3rd semester RN students at the Hampton Campus, with limited availability at the Historic Triangle Campus as space allows. Advanced standing credit will be awarded for 1st and 2nd RN semesters.

Steps to Admission

Step 1: Apply to the College and Submit Official Transcripts

The application for admission to the college is available on the Thomas Nelson website and must be submitted electronically. Official high school transcripts, GED certificates, and official college transcripts must be sent to the Enrollment Services Office. To request a transcript evaluation, please complete and submit the online request form on the Thomas Nelson website. **PN education transcripts and current PN license are required.**

Step 2: Take College Placement Tests

As determined by placement on these tests, satisfactorily complete all required developmental courses prior to application.

Step 3: Complete the Nursing Program Prerequisite Requirements

- High School Chemistry: One year required with a final course grade of “C” or higher OR satisfactory completion of CHM 01, CHM 101, or any higher level CHM course.
- High School Algebra: One year required with a final grade of “C” or higher OR satisfactory completion of Math Modules 1-5 or any higher level MTH course.

In addition to the high school prerequisites, the following courses must be completed with a grade of “C” or higher before application:

- BIO 141 Human Anatomy & Physiology I
- ENG 111 College Composition I
- SDV 100 College Success Skills
- PSY 230 Developmental Psychology
- HLT 230 Nutrition & Human Development
- **BIO 142 Human Anatomy & Physiology II (Required for PN to Professional Nursing CSC applicants only)**

Only these course grades are used to calculate the prerequisite GPA, which must be **2.5 or higher** at the time of application.

Important Note to All Transfer Students: No transfer credit shall be given for courses with grades lower than “C”. Grades earned in transfer courses will be included in the prerequisite GPA.

Step 4: Attend a Nursing Program Information Session and Obtain One Letter of Reference and Resume

Information sessions will be virtual and presentation slides and directions are posted on the Nursing webpage. The reference forms are located on the Nursing webpage under Resources. References and optional resumes and can be submitted to NursingApplication@tncc.edu with your Notice of Intent to Apply.

Step 5: Send a Notice of Intent to Apply

Email your intent to apply to Enrollment Services at NursingApplication@tncc.edu during the application period only. The email must be sent from your Thomas Nelson email address. Include your name and student ID number. You will receive an email from Enrollment Services regarding your eligibility to apply.

In order to be eligible to apply, students must meet the following:

- Successful completion of all 5 nursing program prerequisites
- Meet with an Academic Advisor as necessary for transfer credit award and counseling
- Prerequisite GPA of 2.500 or above
- Official high school transcripts or GED and any other official college transcripts on file and evaluated by Enrollment Services
- Certificate of Attendance from a virtual nursing information session

Step 6: Complete/Submit the Application

After receipt of an eligibility notification, complete the application found on the nursing webpage and submit to Enrollment Services at NursingApplication@tncc.edu. The Information Session Certificate of Attendance, two letters of reference, and optional resumes must be submitted with application.

Step 7: Complete Pre-Admission Testing

The Test of Essential Academic Skills (ATI TEAS) is required for admission and will be scheduled after receipt of application. The ATI TEAS test will be administered on-line, off-campus with remote proctoring, and the scores are good for one year. The cost of the ATI TEAS must be paid with a credit or debit card at the time of testing. Photo identification is required to test. A minimum score of 45% for the Percentile Rank across all ADN programs must be achieved for application to be considered. Review materials and practice tests are available for purchase at <https://www.atitesting.com/Home.aspx>. Remediation and preparation for this exam is highly recommended.

Acceptance

All students who apply to the nursing program will be notified of their admission status by mail. Students applying to the Hampton Campus will be notified by May 1. Students applying to the Historic Triangle Campus will be notified by November 1. There are two types of acceptance: conditional and alternate.

Conditional Acceptance: All students who are awarded conditional acceptance must attend a mandatory orientation session to receive information regarding submission of a physical requirements, validation of current American Heart Association’s Healthcare Provider CPR, and a criminal background check and drug screen. Failure to satisfactorily meet all of the requirements by the due dates identified will result in cancellation of acceptance status to the program.

Alternate Status: Status award because the number of applications that met requirements exceeded the number of students that could be accepted. Accepted students sometimes decline admission, and attrition occurs so alternate students are offered conditional acceptance. Alternates not admitted must reapply next admission period, must maintain a minimum prerequisite GPA of 2.500, and must retake the ATI TEAS test or use previous test score (within one year).
